

Seattle restaurant adds cafe to Vancouver outpost

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The upcoming Vancouver location of Seattle's 13 Coins restaurant will be complemented by a cafe at Kirkland Tower on the Waterfront.

The popular 54-year Seattle eatery announced in March that it would open an outpost in Vancouver. Last week it said it would also open its Coins Coffee House as fast casual spot serving food, espresso and other coffee options.

"With our 50-year history in the coffee city of Seattle, bringing great coffee to downtown Vancouver is an exciting opportunity to expand the 13 Coins concept," Albert Moscatel, partner and co-owner of 13 Coins, said in the announcement. "This is a special place and a special partnership with Kirkland Development; we're looking forward to being part of the Vancouver community."

13 Coins plans to open its 4,856-square-foot restaurant in the Hotel Indigo.

First opened in 1967, the restaurant has locations in Seattle, Bellevue, Washington and Sea-Tac Airport. The Vancouver location will be its fourth.

The Kirkland Tower is also getting a 2,500-square-foot wellness spa with the planned opening of a location of Tigard-based aesthetic boutique Amelie. It will be the second location for the business and will be its flagship, according to a news release.

Other businesses in the tower include El Gaucho restaurant and Evoke Winery.
