HELP YOUR LOCAL BEES PROSPER

Backyard Bird Shop offers shelters for native mason bees

There are many misconceptions surrounding mason bees, according to Backyard Bird Shop outreach coordinator Darlene

Contrary to what some may think, a person does not need to be a gardener or have fruit trees in their yard to host them. Further, the bees do much of their work in the spring, rather than the summer months, and aren't prone to stinging.

And it's for these reasons — as well as the chance to support the insects that facilitate food production — that Betat said local residents should consider hosting mason bees in their backyard.

"I love that they are creating natural foods for our birds and wildlife in an urban setting. And I love watching them. They are super friendly," Betat said.

Backyard Bird Shop has an array of products that can help locals host mason bees such as shelters, nesting trays, tubes and liners. For more information, visit https://backyardbirdshop.com.

Betat said that most neighborhood homes will have the pollen needed for a healthy mason bee habitat and that the only thing humans can help provide is shelter, which she said is often the biggest challenge for the insects. Further, Betat noted that mason bees are native to the area and operate alone rather than working in a hive with a queen — though they nest together. Due to

this lack of a hive, Betat said they are not aggressive or prone to stinging like honeybees.


"They are easy to care for because they are gentle. Honeybees have a hive to protect and will sting you if you approach them," she added. Betat recommended people acquire mason bee shelters in time for their

active season from March to June. Such shelters can be secured to a wall or a tree, among other options. However, they should receive direct sunlight. "Adult females will lay eggs in pre-made nesting tunnels that you provide. and the resulting young spend the winter hibernating in their own waterproof cocoons until emerging the following spring to begin the process anew," Betat

said. In terms of pollination, Betat said that one female mason bee is as productive as 100 honeybees. And Betat said those who create bee habitats can notice the white mustaches on the males as the bees rest in their tunnels, follow them around the yard to see which plants they frequent and watch busy female bees return to the nest covered in pollen.

"It's a fun backyard project that gives you a peek into a bee's life while benefiting these champion pollinators who help provide food for birds and other wildlife, and for humans too," she said.

while the bed is fastened into the wall. Savaria also noted that California Closets makes the opening and closing of the wall bed safe for families.


"The quality of the mechanism we carry is top of the line and it's really safe for families and even older generations to operate," she said.

Fit for Life 365 members looking for a fun new way to challenge their bodies, as well as their brains, can now try step classes three times a week.

Step instructor Rachel, who has over 15 years of experience teaching a variety of fitness classes, began leading step classes at Fit for Life in the Central Village about a month ago.

Rachel hosts the hour-long classes at 7:15 p.m. Tuesdays and Thursdays and 9 a.m. Saturdays.

Though she's also taught cardio, weight and Zumba classes, Rachel said step is her favorite format because it's a mental challenge as much as a physical one. Step is a fun way to improve

strength, stamina and coordination, she added.

Over the first several sessions, many attendees returned, but new ones come each time as well. Rachel said she's heard people mention they like the class because it makes them sweat but thinking about the steps means they don't have to think about how hard they're working.

She also mentioned people seem happy to be back to in-person classes, something she's enjoying as well.

"It feels great to me because it's my first time teaching after everything closed down," Rachel said. "It's nice to be given the opportunity to teach a class and especially teach a step class."

Part of the reason she's enjoying teaching so much is the friendly atmosphere and positive community at Fit for Life.

Nature's Pet has gear to keep pets dry and warm

Boots and coats protect dogs from the elements

While the snow is hopefully in the rearview mirror for the Portland metro area, there are likely plenty of cold and rainv days still to come this spring. Nature's Pet in the West Linn Central Village has the essentials to keep your dog warm and dry even on a wet Oregon

From parkas and sweaters to raincoats, boots and super-soaking towels, the store has what your pet needs to enjoy the outdoors no matter the weather.

Owner Mason Hartman pointed to the shop's wide selection of dog outerwear from brands like Canada Pooch, Ruffwear and Gold Paw.

While it's important to keep your pet warm and comfortable, Hartman noted that some dog breeds likely don't need layers to keep warm.

"Generally with a double-coated dog like a husky or a German Shepherd, they don't really need a jacket," Hartman said. "But dogs with short-hair like a pitbull or Chihuahua, dachshunds with short-hair, they tend to need a little bit extra to keep them warm."

Still, owners of longer-haired dogs might like a rain coat to keep them dry. Keeping the fur dry can cut down on mess and help keep their coat nice, Hartman said.

Nature's Pet sells rain gear from Ruffwear and Canada Pooch in a variety of sizes and colors. The store also carries Canada Pooch's snow suit, a full-body water-resistance thermal suit for keeping your dog warm and dry.

To keep dogs warm on chilly days, look for knit sweaters, Canada Pooch's flannel hoodie or Goldpaw's fleece jacket that has a waterproof softshell. Hartman also pointed to Ruffwear's jacket-harness combo, which will keep dogs warm and connect to their leash.

Additionally, Nature's Pet carries several socks and booties to protect dogs' paws from the cold, ice, snow and rain. Nature's Pet has durable booties from Ruffwear and RC pets as well as reusable and disposable rubber dog boots from Pawz.

The Pawz boots, which can be used multiple times and thrown away, come in packs of twelve in a variety of sizes and colors. The boots are bio-degradable and can be thrown away when worn down. Pawz boots were invented by a dog owner who became frustrated when the boots he bought for his dog constantly fell off. The boots gently hug your dog's paw like a sock to prevent them from slipping off.

Hartman also pointed out the Soggy Doggy, a microfiber towel that will soak up water on your dog's fur after walking or playing in the rain.




